	Acts of Attainder	A declaration that a landowner was guilty of rebelling against the monarch, thus losing land and titles.
	Enclosure	Public land that is fenced off by major land owners, often for the rearing of sheep.
	Extraordinary revenue	Money raised by the king from additional sources or one-off payments in times of emergency (parliamentary rants, clerical taxes).
	Gentry	People with considerable social status, below the nobility (Knights, major landowners, courtly connections, considerable income.
	Heresy	The denial of / non-belief in key teachings of the Church.
	Holy Roman Empire	Loose federation of 300 states in and around modern day Germany. Elected Emperors. Dominated by the Habsburg dynasty.
	Patronage	When privilege or status is granted to an individual by someone in authority as a reward for loyalty e.g. the monarch granting a peerage.
	Privy Chamber	The most private area of the court where the close personal servants have direct access to the monarch.
	Purgatory	A Catholic belief in the existence of s state in which the souls of the dead were purged before they could enter heaven.
	Reformation	A sixteenth century movement opposing the Catholic Church.
	Renaissance	A cultural and intellectual movement, beginning in Italy, which emphasised a revival of classical learning and the arts.
	Transubstantiation	Catholic belief that the bread and wine changed into the body and blood of Christ when consecrated at Mass.
