Students are expected to attend all 3 days		

What to wear

Comfortable clothes e.g. joggers/leggings, t-shirts, sweatshirt/hoodie, trainers. They do not need to wear their HGS uniform or Primary School uniform.

What to bring

- filled water bottle
- pencil and pen
- set of headphones that can be plugged into a PC (jack or USB)
- **£10 in cash on the first day** for school lunches or a packed lunch each day. We will email a link to the menu on Thursday 3 July

Arriving at school

The doors will open at 8.40am on each day and students should enter via main reception (located on Arthurs Avenue). Our Year 7 students will be available to help students.

On Tuesday, students will be guided by our Year 7 students to the Main Hall to meet their form tutor and attend their first assembly.

On Wednesday and Thursday, using the navigation skills acquired on Tuesday, students will make their own way to their form room. Our Year 7 students will be on hand to help.

Plan for the days

Across the three days they will complete a series of activities to help them get to know other students, their form tutor and navigate around the school. They will also attend sample lessons in the following subjects English, Maths, Science, Modern Foreign Languages, Humanities (Geography, History and Religious Studies), PE, Performing Arts and Art/Design.

During the three days we will complete some diagnostic tests. These tests assess the ability to reason with and manipulate different types of material through a series of Verbal, Non-Verbal, Quantitative and Spatial Ability tasks. Together, these tests provide the school and teachers with a profile of each student's reasoning abilities, and as such the core abilities related to learning. These tests, alongside KS2 scores, will provide additional information for each of their classroom teachers to ensure they receive high quality, personalised teaching. The tests require no preparation and form a very small part of the three-day programme.

End of the day

School will finish at 3pm.

We assume students have your permission to walk home. If you would prefer to collect your child from school, please do let us know by emailing mail@hgs.rkt.co.uk with details of the person collecting your child. Students with older siblings at the school can take the school bus with prior arrangement with the bus company.
