Year 12 Welcome and Key Information

We would like to welcome all Year 12 students to the new school year. We are pleased with how our students have embraced the first week with such maturity, positivity and focus, and we are confident that they will continue to work hard to realise their potential.

This letter provides key information about the arrangements for Year 12 and provides answers to some questions you may have.

Year 12 Welcome Evening

We are holding a Welcome Evening for Year 12 parents and carers on two evenings in September. These events take place in school on Tuesday 16 and Wednesday 17 September at 6.30. During the evening you will meet some of the Sixth Form Team, hear more about the Sixth Form and how you can support your son/daughter, and have the opportunity to ask any questions. This event is equally important for families of students who have progressed from the main school at HGS as it is for those joining us new to the school, and we hope that you will join us on one of these two evenings. The information provided at these events will be the same on both evenings.

Progress and Support

The Sixth Form is divided into tutorial groups. Each group has a Form Tutor who will work closely with your son/daughter to discuss and monitor progress throughout the year. The Form Tutor will register students on a daily basis and will lead a Progression session during period 1 on a Tuesday which covers important topics about careers, progression routes beyond the Sixth Form, study skills, and personal and social issues.

The Sixth Form Leadership Team supports our students on a daily basis. The team includes a Director and Assistant Director, two Student Support Managers, and a number of other staff performing key roles. Contact details for members of the team can be found in the <u>Sixth Form Handbook</u>

We carefully monitor student progress and keep you informed through progress reports, a Parental consultation evening, and end of year internal examinations. Sixth Form mindset

A Level and BTEC qualifications require a full two-year commitment before final examinations at the end of Year 13. Successful students adapt to the intensity of sixth form study through hard work and a willingness to take increased responsibility for their own learning. We welcome your support in helping to establish an effective routine of independent study outside of school.

We work with students to develop the VI HGS mindset framed around 5 elements: Vision, Impact, Habits, Growth, Service. It is important that students commit to developing this positive mindset from the start of Year 12 to build the foundation for success.

Students are expected to complete a minimum of 5 hours of independent study per subject, per week. This includes regular home learning as set by teachers, and independent study work.

A structured programme of independent study work in each subject area instructs students in how to build knowledge in each area over time and supports them to develop purposeful and productive independent study habits. Students access study tasks through a Year 12 Study class on Showbie, accessed via their iPad. It is expected that they engage fully with these materials to guide their independent study.

Sixth Form Standards

We set high standards in the Sixth Form, and these expectations have been reiterated to students at the start of term. Full details of the routines and expectations can be found in the <u>Sixth Form Handbook</u>. Students have signed a Learning Agreement in which they have committed to upholding the standards outlined in this document. We also ask that parents/carers sign the electronic copy of the <u>Sixth Form Learning Agreement</u> if you have not already done so.

High levels of attendance in school and in lessons has a direct impact on positive academic outcomes. We expect high levels of attendance throughout the academic year, and we will contact you if there is an unexplained absence. We monitor attendance trends closely and will put supportive measures in place if attendance falls below 97%. Please call Mrs Reed (01423 535236) or email reedt@hgs.rklt.co.uk before 10am in the case of illness so that staff can be informed. Routine medical and dental appointments should be made outside school time.

Year 12 students are required to register at **8.50am** in their form room on a daily basis. Students are required to sign in and out at break and lunch times via our electronic inventory system using their school ID badge. Where parents/carers have provided authorisation through the Learning Agreement, students will be granted home study if they have a free period at the end of the day.

Sixth Form students are required to dress smartly as the most senior students in the school. We insist on high standards of appearance and students are also issued with an ID badge and lanyard. This must be visibly worn at all times to help safeguard all members of our community. If students do not adhere to our dress code they will first be spoken to by a member of the Sixth Form Team. If students persistently fail to meet our expectations, then parents / carers will be contacted. The dress code can be found on the school website: here
