Did you know it is Biology Week? This is a week which celebrates the innovation in biology which helps support all life on Earth now and in the coming decades, it helps raise the profile of these achievements, and the important work that bioscientists are doing.

How are we Biology Week at HGS?

 Students have been participating in Biology Spelling Bee. Each year competed in their classes with the top speller entered into round 2 to compete against the top spellers in their year group. Their results have been entered into the national competition (against 257 other students), results are expected next week. The competition has created a buzzzz around biology.



- Biology activities will take place across all year groups in science lessons including:
 - Memory games relating to bioscience careers
 - Interactive scientific guizzes
 - Fun experiments to try at home e.g. how do butterflies drink?
 - Online lectures
- The BioCraft Competition will be launched, can we reach the final for a second year running? Students will find out more in their science lessons. Closing date for entries is Friday 7 November.





Your generosity and commitment mean we can continue to grow and strengthen our support for young people who are struggling with their mental health in Harrogate District. The compassion shown by the students, staff, and wider school community over the past school are not as been truly inspiring, and we are so thankful for the dedication of everyone who contributed to this emazing fundrialising effort.

Since launching in April 2025, we have been able to launch a young person counselling service, young people drop-in and workshops for schools and youth clubs; these services have supported local young people aged 11-18 who are facing mental health challenges such as anxiety, bereavement, self-harm, eating disorders, and childhood trauma. These are young people who often cannot access CAMHS, are on long school waiting lists, or feel unable to speak openly in a school setting.
