## Spotlight: Holocaust Memorial



Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) takes place on 27 January each year and is a time to remember the millions of people murdered during the Holocaust, under Nazi Persecution and in the genocides, which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

Holocaust Memorial Day is a time when we seek to learn the lessons of the past and recognise that genocide does not just take place on its own – it is a process which can begin if discrimination, racism and hatred are not checked and prevented. We are fortunate here in the UK; we are not at immediate risk of genocide. However, discrimination has not ended, nor has the use of the language of hatred or exclusion.

There is still much to do to create a safer future and HMD is an opportunity to start this process.

The theme this year is 'Bridging Generations', this is a reminder that the responsibility of remembrance does not end with the survivors – it lives on through their children, their grandchildren and through all of us. This year's theme encourages us all to engage actively with the past – to listen, to learn and to carry those lessons forward. By doing so, we build a bridge between memory and action, between history and hope for the future.

Genocide doesn't discriminate by age: infants, children, adults and the elderly have all experienced unimaginable suffering in different ways. In many cases, entire family lines were erased. We are invited to honour each life – and honour those who left no family to carry their legacy – whose legacies live through books, films and other interpretations.



We are all ordinary people today who can be extraordinary in our actions.

We can all make decisions to challenge, stand up to hatred and to speak out. If you witness or experience any form of bullying or harassment, then please speak to an adult in school or use the REACH Out form to report it.

## Spotlight: World Religion Day



World Religion Day 2026 takes place on Sunday 18 January.

It takes place each January, aiming to promote understanding and peace between all religions as well as mutual understanding and tolerance between people from different backgrounds.

World Religion Day was established by the Bahá'í Faith community in the United States in 1950. This day encourages people of all backgrounds to explore the teachings and principles of various religions and to promote unity and understanding among different faiths.

World Religion Day 2026 is a day dedicated to acknowledging and respecting the various religious traditions and beliefs practised around the world. It encourages individuals to learn about different religions, engage in interfaith conversations, and work towards a more harmonious and inclusive society.

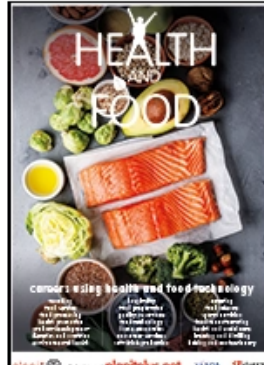
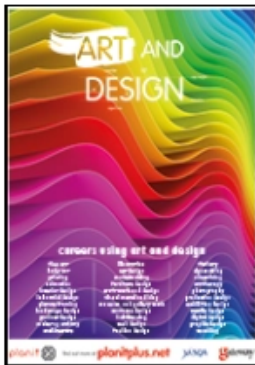
