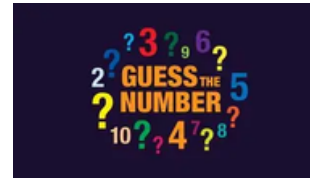

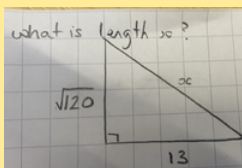

We are delighted to launch our 'Preparing for your Exams' booklet.

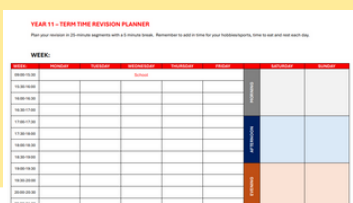
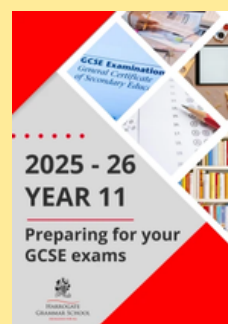
This contains:
