Careers Education Information and Guidance (CEIAG) at HGS

As a student you are entitled to expect that school will:

- Provide you with the opportunity to learn the skills and gain the knowledge you will need to secure further or higher education/training/employment after leaving school
- Offer you CEIAG support as you need it and at key points in your education such as KS4 Options, Post 16 Choices and Post 18 transition to further study or employment
- Guarantee you access to careers information, advice and guidance which is up to date, comprehensive and unbiased including Labour Market Information
- Ensure you have access to professional and expert guidance when you need it
- Guarantee access to information about all the options/pathways open to you once you leave school

As a school we expect that the student will:

- Be active in helping themselves plan for their future as well as expecting us to help them
- Be prepared to be realistic in considering the range of options available and in making choices about them
- Be prepared to learn and stretch themselves in order to reach their potential working to the best of their ability at all times

As a parent/carer you are entitled to expect that Harrogate Grammar School will:

- Enable you to take an active part in the processes described above which include attendance at parent consultation evenings and other events such as Options Evenings and the Careers Fair and to attend your child's careers guidance interview if you wish
- Promote and practice equal opportunities for all young people regardless of gender, ethnic origin and disability.
