



Careers Education at Harrogate Grammar School 2025 - 2026

The aims of our Careers Guidance Programme for all students are:

- ✓ To provide excellent careers guidance which helps to inspire students towards further study and should enable them to make informed decisions whenever choices are open to them
- ✓ To ensure that students know about the world of work and which skills they will need to succeed so they can find themselves in rewarding jobs which fit their skills

We want all students to be able to develop themselves through careers, employability and enterprise education opportunities so they can develop the following skills:

- ✓ Self-awareness encourages students to realistically appraise their qualities and skills, roles and responsibilities, values and attitudes, needs and interests, aptitudes and achievements so they are better able to understand themselves, make informed choices and relate well to others
- ✓ Self-determination boosts hope, optimism, adaptability and resilience. It empowers students to realise their aspirations and manage their careers
- ✓ Self-improvement it encourages positive attitudes to lifelong learning and the skills of planning, review and reflection. Students understand what they have learned, what they need to learn next and how they learn best to enable them to develop their potential

Employability Skills

We want students to understand the importance of having good employability skills as we know that along with good subject knowledge and technical understanding, employers often outline a set of skills that they want from an employee. These skills are what they believe will equip the employee to carry out their role to the best of their ability. Employability depends on your knowledge, skills and attitudes, how you use those assets, and how you present them to employers. We will be encouraging students to develop and reflect on these skills every year:

The Careers Journey at HGS – 'Your Future, Your Choice'

Year 7 and Year 8

You will be completing lessons and activities which encourage you to develop your self-awareness and to find out more about your likes and dislikes, which subjects you particularly enjoy, what are your talents, interests and motivation. You will be using careers programmes in school to research career areas to find out more about the world of work and looking at aspects of work or careers you think you would prefer. You and your parents/carers will also be invited to the annual HGS Careers Fair in the Autumn Term. Year 7 and Year 8 will also have the opportunity to participate in a Big Picture Careers Morning, visit Future Ready Friday pop-up careers themed stands during the year and complete different activities during the National T Level Week/National Green Careers Week/National Apprenticeship Week/National Careers Week to learn more about pathways and opportunities available in the future.

Year 9

You will be planning your future subject choices and options and selecting your subjects for GCSE study in Year 10 and 11 so you need to start to thinking about your strengths, likes and dislikes and further study options. You will receive advice and guidance about the options process for selecting your GCSE subject choices through Big Picture lessons, the Year 9 Curriculum Choice Option Information iBook, Parents Consultation Evening, presentations and the opportunity to talk to subject staff at the Year 9 Options Evening and assemblies for Year 9

students explaining the process. You and your parents/carers will also be invited to the annual HGS Careers Fair in the Autumn Term. Year 9 will also have the opportunity to participate in a Big Picture Careers Morning, visit Future Ready Friday pop-up careers themed stands during the year and complete different activities during the National T Level Week/National Green Careers Week/National Apprenticeship Week/National Careers Week to learn more about pathways and opportunities available in the future.

Year 10

You will be starting your important GCSE courses and developing your self-awareness, finding out more about your likes and dislikes, which subjects do you particularly enjoy, what are you skilled at and the importance of developing interests and hobbies both inside and outside school. You will be encouraged to start thinking about gaining wider skills in relation to what you want to do longer term as well as learning about different aspects of work by considering employment trends and opportunities using Labour Market Information and by completing a virtual work experience programme. The Year 10 World of Work Week in July will provide the opportunity for you to find out more about different careers and the workplace as you complete an in-person work placement. You and your parents/carers will also be invited to the annual HGS Careers Fair in the Autumn Term. Year 10 will also have the opportunity to participate in a Big Picture Careers Morning, visit Future Ready Friday pop-up careers themed stands during the year and complete different activities during the National T Level Week/National Green Careers Week/National Apprenticeship Week/National Careers Week to learn more about pathways and opportunities available in the future.

Year 11

You will be completing the final year of your GCSE subjects and starting to plan for your Post-16 options. You will have the opportunity to attend a careers interview with one of the HGS Careers Advisers to support your decision making and the session will include a personalised discussion about your options and choices, study preferences, academic progress, employment ideas and trends, aspects of work, talents, skills and abilities. You will be provided with independent, impartial information advice and guidance and you will be supported by an Action Plan which is created by you and the careers adviser agreeing on the next steps you need to take to help you plan and be successful. Year 11 also participate in their Big Picture Careers Super Learning Day in the Autumn Term which provides the opportunity to speed network with employers and education providers to find out more about different job sectors and pathways students could consider in the future. Students will also receive advice about applying for jobs and interview techniques as well as the opportunity to work in groups to develop employability skills completing an enterprise challenge. Year 11 will also attend the HGS Sixth Form Taster Day in January and there will be an alternative day

provided for students who are not intending to stay and would like support with their Post-16 option plans. You will also have the opportunity to complete another virtual work experience placement and will also be invited to the annual HGS Careers Fair in the Autumn Term. Year 11 will also have the opportunity to visit Future Ready Friday pop-up careers themed stands during the year and complete different activities during the National T Level Week/National Green Careers Week/National Apprenticeship Week/National Careers Week to learn more about pathways and opportunities available in the future.

Year 12 and Year 13

In Sixth Form, you will be offered advice and guidance to help you plan for your future. Whilst the majority of our students progress into Higher Education, increasingly more students are taking alternative routes into employment. You will be encouraged to explore all options and take responsibility for your decisions. You will be supported throughout by a team of experienced staff and any member of the Sixth Form team is available to meet with students and parents to discuss options at any stage. Students can also request an interview at any stage with a fully qualified independent external careers advisor. A number of activities provided during the year for students include:

- Progression Events a comprehensive programme of activities, designed to prepare students for higher education, employment or apprenticeships
- Sixth Form Work Experience all Year 12 students will be offered a placement during the Summer term
- Guest Speakers from a variety of employment sectors and HE institutions
- Visits to Universities
- Volunteering opportunities
- · Package talks from leading professionals
- A Higher Education and Finance Information Evening
- Opportunity to attend the annual HGS Careers Fair
- Access to UNIFROG website. This is an award-winning platform which helps students to make intelligent choices about their future while allowing teachers to track their progress
