





Type 1: Research intensive universities


Academic and research focus, 'traditional' subjects, 21st century research, solving world problems, Russell Group and others

Type 2: Regional/vocationally focused universities

Vocationally focused, greater emphasis on teaching skills and sector focused, Millennium Plus group and others


City/campus-based – (20 –to 40,000 students)






5. Student finance

Study first, pay later

Applying for Student Finance means you apply for <u>two</u> financial loans:

1. Tuition Fee Loan




To pay university fees

2. Maintenance Loan



To afford to live while studying




1. Tuition Fee Loan

Tuition fees are currently capped at £9,250 per year

Tuition fee loans of up to this amount go straight to the university

All home students can apply for full tuition fee loan

Remember – there are no upfront fees for university!




2. Maintenance Loan

The Maintenance Loan is a contribution to living costs

All home students can apply for the base amount, the rest is means tested

Paid into the student's bank account

Paid in at the beginning of each term






4. Scholarships and Bursaries

Scholarships and bursaries are also available

They can be awarded for a variety of reasons

Not one standard application form

They don't need to be paid back



Lancaster's Scholarships – 2023 Entry



Lancaster Scholarship

£2,000

for the first year of study only

For UK Applicants

paying home fees who firmly accept their offer

AAA+ (or equivalent)

Plus at least 5 GCSEs grade A/7 or above

All full-time UG degrees

For October 2022 entry

Lancaster Opportunity Scholarship

£1,000

per year of study

For UK Applicants

from either a low participation neighbourhood and/or are care experienced

In receipt of a contextually lower offer to study at Lancaster

For October 2022 entry

All UG degrees

Except MBChB Medicine & Surgery

Lancaster Global Scholarship

£5,000

for the first year of entry (undergraduate only)

For International Applicants

Liable for international tuition fees

A*A*A (or equivalent)


Plus at least 5 GCSEs grade A/7 or above

All full-time UG degrees

For October 2022 entry

The Repayment System 23/24

- Repayments begin from the April after students graduate.
- Everyone pays 9% of anything earned <u>after £25,000</u>.
- Repayments are based on what is earned and not what is owed.
- After 40 years the loan is written off.






Repayment Scale

Salary (before tax)	Monthly Repayment Post Academic Year 23/24
£25,000	£O
£28,000	£17
£30,000	£32
£35,000	£69
£40,000	£107
£50,000	£182

Approximate monthly repayment from April 2027 based on estimated first RPI linked new plan type increase

Interest

- Interest is added as soon as the first payments are made
- While in study, interest is applied at **RPI**
- RPI is Retail Price Index and the rate is set annually
- When you enter repayment, interest rates will be linked to what you earn, from RPI only to RPI





Apply to up to five Universities (4 for some courses)


UCAS deadline is January 31 2024 (16 Oct 2023 for Oxbridge)
