Competition – Design a Mural for a Greener, Cleaner, Cooler World

The Grantham Climate Art Prize is a competition for young artists aged 11-25 from across the UK to draw attention to the climate crisis and the need for urgent, positive action through powerful public art.

We are asking young people to design a mural that highlights the theme of climate change and its impact on the planet.

Explore your creativity and imagination to come up with a hopeful vision for a greener, cleaner world. For inspiration check out <u>the 9</u> things you can do about climate change.





Three winning designs will be recreated by professional mural artists in three major cities.

Winners will receive a £500 prize, with 6 runners-up receiving £250.

Their work will also be shown on bus shelters, the tube network and billboards across London to reach politicians, decision makers and millions of people before the 2023 UN Climate Change Conference COP28 starts in November.

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Spotlight: Celebrating the School Year

Another busy year at HGS! Here are some interesting facts about what we achieved in 2022/2023:

Did you know?



We have had 41 trips that took place this academic year supporting our curriculum. Over 3600 students participated. Students have travelled to many locations including France, Naples, Wales, York, London, multiple University trips, weekend trips to Condover Hall for Netball and Football, Rewards trips to Flamingo Land and Bradford, as well as Geography, History, Maths and Science trips and our first post-pandemic exchange programme to Germany.



In addition to the trips that have taken place, more than 95 clubs/activities/groups took place across the year. The Sustainability team secured \pounds 250 for the school to use on promoting active travel.

HGS have played in over 300 sporting fixtures across a wide range of sports with individuals and teams reaching area, regional and national finals.

In Performing Arts, over 900 students have taken part in a school play, concert, gig, theatre visit or workshop. Year 7 have enjoyed free taster lessons across a range of instruments.

There have been many more things to celebrate this year, including two students awarded the Arkwright Engineering Scholarship, a fabulous Art and Design exhibition displaying all the fantastic A level and GCSE work and our annual celebration evening



24 House events have taken place this year.
