Congratulations to Lillie Houseman (A Level Art student) who has recently received the 'Top 10 to watch' award alongside an award from Tu Clothing.




Good luck to Lucy Ireland, who has been cast as Sophie Sheridan in the hit musical, Mamma Mia onboard the Allure of the Seas.
